‘Setting the Conditions for Victory’ video debuts

‘How We Fight’ video follow-up now available online

Secretary of the Air Force Michael Wynne released an 8 minute video presentation called “Setting the Conditions for Victory.” The video outlines the Air Force role in the global war on terror, and how we succeed in our warfighting domains of **air, space and cyberspace**

"Air dominance matters. The Air Force has been at war for 17 years and it hasn't been easy or without its cost." Secretary Wynne said. "Today our space assets provide us with unprecedented intelligence, surveillance and reconnaissance capabilities and allow us to network with our forces across the globe."

Even more than space, the new American way of war is dependent on cyberspace as virtually all ISR and communications flow through computers. And in a broader sense, the entire nation has become dependent on cyberspace, from personnel systems to finance to utilities, Secretary Wynne said.

The video features several Airmen, as well as sister service members, discussing the Air Force’s role in the joint fight and how we “fly, fight and win.”

- “Setting the Conditions for Victory” is a follow-up to a video released last year called “How We Fight,” and defines how the Air Force provides the president and combatant commanders sovereign options in defense of the nation, its allies and its interests

- Airmen and civilians who view the video will be better equipped to explain the Air Force mission to their friends and family and why what we do is so important
